Dear FBC Family,

I hope that you have been enjoying our study of Colossians as much as I have.

The emphasis is both encouraging and convicting! We will return to our study. Lord



convicting! We will return to our study, Lord willing, after Easter.

I've shared with you that my wife, Kim, is writing the prayer articles for our home church as we also are going through the search for a lead pastor. I wanted to share just a portion of her most recent article during this Lenten season on *Pursuing THE LORD OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS*:

"Jesus began preparing His disciples for what was to come. He talked about obedience, righteousness, suffering, denial, cross-carrying, death. Nothing in His words included crowds, fame, miracles, or glory. Jesus told them plainly that He was going to die, and that He would rise from the dead three days later. (Mark 9:31). "But they did not understand...and were afraid to ask Him." (Mark 9:32, NKJV)

The more intimate Jesus became with His disciples, the more guarded they became toward Him. These who had been so excited to share the glories of successful ministry (Mark 6:12-13, 30), suddenly became uncomfortable, hesitant to talk openly to Him, afraid of what He would say. He had spoken about things they did not want to believe, and now their hearts became hardened to the truth. As they turned away from talking with Jesus, they turned toward one another, focused on their own agenda: Who was the greatest among them?

Jesus graciously responded to their unspoken questions about Himself, about greatness, and about the future. In Mark 9:35-37 (NASB, 1995), 'If anyone wants to be first, he shall be last of all and servant of all...Whoever receives one child like this in My name receives Me...Whoever gives a cup of water ... he will not lose his reward.' The way to greatness meant loving the most insignificant and leading them to the Most Significant. It was not about the crowds. It was not about greatness. It was about another Kingdom, not of this world. It was about the Gospel. It was about Love. It was about THE LORD OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS. (Jeremiah 23:6).

Prayer is one of these disciplines. Jesus invited Peter, James, and John to watch and pray with Him in the Garden of Gethsemane, saying to them, 'Keep watching and praying that you may not come into temptation; the spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak.' (Mark 14:38, NASB 1995)"

Kim puts this challenge so well I wanted to share it with you. As we approach the Cross and Resurrection Sunday may our prayers, like our Savior's on that same path that only He could take for us, intensify in obedience to His words, "Keep watching and praying that you may not come into temptation; the spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak." (Mark 14:38, NASB 1995)"


